*Important: Students must be up to date with childhood vaccinations and be available on both the recruitment day (21 November 2023) and for commencement day (29 January 2024).*

*It is important to note that while you are completing the HLT33115 Certificate III in Health Services Assistance under school based traineeship arrangements that, you will be required you to work 1 day a week a min 7.5 hours during the school term and 2-3 days a week over the school holiday blocks to ensure you have completed the min 375hours as outlined on the QTIS Website to be eligible for completion of the traineeship within 12mths from your start date.*
