Financial support

Government support

Did you know that the Australian government provides financial support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students undertaking further education and training?

• <u>ABSTUDY</u> provides financial help to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians who are studying or undertaking an Australian apprenticeship.

Scholarships

Did you know that there are scholarships available for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander young people that can help pay for further education and training and/or living expenses while studying?

- The <u>Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Pharmacy Scholarship Scheme</u> offers three scholarships each year for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students wishing to study pharmacy.
- The <u>Puggy Hunter Memorial Scholarship Scheme</u> offers financial assistance to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students studying towards an entry-level qualification in an eligible health-related discipline at an Australian university or TAFE (certificate IV and above).



• Each of Queensland's universities offers awards and scholarships for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.

University & TAFE support

There are support services for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at <u>TAFE and at</u> each of Queensland's universities.

- <u>Australian Catholic University</u> the <u>Indigenous Higher Education Units</u> provide social, cultural, personal and academic support for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.
- <u>CQUniversity</u> The Office of Indigenous Engagement encourages Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students to take up every opportunity for successs. This includes applying for and asking for assistance where needed. Tutoring can also be arranged for students in an undergraduate program.
- <u>Griffith University</u> The <u>GUMURRII Unit</u> can help students choose a course of study, enrol, and apply for grants and scholarships. The university's Hands Up! Tertiary Preparation program assists first year students to adapt to university life and improve their academic skills in a relaxed and supportive environment.
- <u>James Cook University</u> The <u>Indigenous Student Support Services</u> unit provides financial and study support services for students.
- <u>Queensland University of Technology</u> <u>Oodgeroo Unit</u> staff members provide oneon-one support for students who gain entry to the university through the Oodgeroo Alternative Entry Program.
- <u>The University of Queensland</u> The <u>Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Studies Unit</u> provides personal and academic support services.
- <u>University of Southern Queensland</u> The <u>College for Indigenous Studies</u>, <u>Education</u> <u>and Research (CISER)</u> supports students before and during their studies at the university.
- <u>University of the Sunshine Coast</u> The <u>Indigenous Services</u> team provides a range of support services, including an orientation program, tutorial assistance scheme and Indigenous Alternative Entry Program.

Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships – Message from Karen Andrews MP

Rural and Regional Enterprise Scholarships program are now open and would encourage you to promote this scholarship program to your students.

Eligible students could benefit from up to \$18,000 towards the cost of studying an eligible university or vocational education course.

The second round saw scholarships offered to students on the Gold Coast undertaking undergraduate, postgraduate and Vocational Education and Training (VET) science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM) courses.

Round three has been expanded to include all areas of study, and I hope there will be a record number of applications from across the Gold Coast.

The scholarships cover courses ranging from certificate IV through to PhD level, with support for those seeking flexible study arrangements, as well as providing \$500 for students undertaking an internship to ensure they are job-ready.

I encourage all prospective students living on the Gold Coast who need financial support to gain a tertiary qualification or undertake further study to apply.

Applications for the third round close on 14 June 2019.

Year 12 Students wanting to do Medicine or Dentistry at UQ in 2020 please be aware that the UMAT Admissions Test will be replaced by UCAT in 2019

Beginning with current Year 11's, all applicants intending to sit the UMAT in 2019 for entry to university in 2020 will need to sit the new University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT). From 2019 onwards, the UMAT test will be discontinued.

UCAT will become be a mandatory admissions test for the Doctor of Medicine (provisional entry) and Dental Science at The University of Queensland.

The registration for the UCAT will open in March 2019 and close in mid-May. The UCAT will be offered on a choice of dates throughout the month of July, rather than on one single date.

The test consists of five, separately timed, subtests:

- Verbal Reasoning
- Decision Making
- Quantitative Reasoning
- Abstract Reasoning
- Situational Judgement Test

Candidates should be aware that whilst there are many commercial companies publishing books and offering coaching for our tests, the UCAT ANZ Consortium does not work with any of these companies or endorse the use of their materials. Taking advantage of these opportunities can cost candidates a great deal of money and we would advise you to be sceptical about claims they can help you do well in the test by coaching.

The ABC Heywire Competition

The University Clinical Aptitude Test is a compulsory test that you'll have to sit in order to apply for some degrees in the fields of medicine or dentistry.

If you're thinking of applying to Uni fin 2020 for a degree in one of those fields, you should check their entry requirements to see if the UCAT is necessary for you to sit.

Registrations close on 17 May and the tests are taken between 1 and 31 July 2019.

It costs \$298 to sit the test (\$198 concession fee but you only have until 10 May to register for concession prices).

Psychologist

What do they do?

Psychologists are health professionals who specialise in the treatment of mental health problems and human behaviour. There are lots of different fields of psychology, specialising in different fields.

They assess, diagnose, and treat the psychological problems and the behavioural dysfunctions resulting from, or related to physical and mental health. Promote healthy behaviours and help to improve the quality of life for their patients. They can work in hospitals, private clinics, research institutes, the community, schools, forensics, businesses and sports. If you're fascinated by human behaviour and how people respond to certain events or triggers in their lives. If you're passionate about helping people embrace healthy behaviours that could improve their quality of life, then a career as a psychologist may be very rewarding.

Duties:

- Clinical Psychologists provide counselling and psychotherapy for people of all ages with life adjustment issues, emotional disorders or mental illness
- Clinical Psychologists provide diagnostic assessment or "testing" services
- Forensic Psychologists conduct studies and clinical evaluations, to formulate expert opinions used to help in criminal, civil and family law cases
- Criminal Forensic Psychologists work for Courts, lawyers, as well as in prisons and other institutions, they're the experts called in to advise on sanity and trial competency evaluations
- Educational Psychologists, School Psychologists, and Clinical Psychologists provide psychoeducational testing and counselling, helping people who are struggling at school and beyond
- Health Psychologists and Clinical Psychologists research and try to find links between medical complaints and psychological factors
- Neuropsychologists diagnose mental and behavioural problems that are related to brain injuries
- Organisational Psychologists focus on how to improve or change the productivity of groups and individuals in the workplace
- Sports Psychologists provide training to enhance the performance of teams and individual competitors.
