Message from Director - Andy Lovell



As we fast approach the end of another busy term we have the opportunity to reflect on quite a few significant achievements for our boys here at the Clontarf room:

Attendance

Overall attendance for the term has sat at 80% which sits above the school average (a significant result given the instances of absences due to sickness throughout the whole school

Camps

We ran a camp for every year cohort except Year 12 who, due to their heavy workload and commitments we chose to take them for a day trip to Byron to continue to explore their leadership potential. Other year groups attended camps at Currumbin Valley & Tallebudgera Creek as a part of the Clontarf Gold Coast Cup Rugby League Tournament. These are a great tool for our staff to continue to build layers into our relationships with the boys and provide them

with a whole range of different life experiences outside of the classroom.

Worksite visits

As a part of our ongoing commitment to building capacity within our boys for work we are lucky to be associated with a number of excellent corporate partners who allow us to expose the boys to an array of different workplace experiences including Kmart, BIG W, Coates Hire, Woolworths and Bunnings.

We thank our many great partners for their generosity of time and expertise in allowing our boys to get a look at what is possible in the employment space going forward as they progress through their school journey.

Educational Tours

Alongside our workplace space we have developed strong links with a number of local universities including Griffith, Bond and Southern Cross University which has allowed us chaperone many of our Year 10 11 & 12 boys on campus tours and discover the many and varied opportunities that exist within the tertiary education sector as well as the many alternate pathways into university.

Educational Support

Despite the challenges with illness that has struck many families this winter we have teamed up with the teachers to offer consistent levels of support for our boys across all disciplines and subjects. The boys have been proactive in seeking help when they need it and the teachers continue to communicate regularly around the boys' academic progress.

Community

We are ever conscious of connecting our boys and our Foundation to the local community and this term we have been able to participate in a number of special community activities including:

Camp Highlights



Year 8/9 Camp

After getting over the Covid restrictions, flooding and dodging around the boys busy Rugby schedule we found a time to take Year 8/9 to Talle Rec School.

The theme for this camp was respect and leadership, and Bryce Roberts at the Rec School created a program which helped lead the boys into some self discovery about what those words mean.

On the first day the boys did a 5km bush walk, which included various team building exercises along the way. Some unlikely leaders shone throughout the day and was a really good exercise for this particular group and in their own words they felt more like a team than they did at the start of the day.

Following on from this the boys were very lucky to have the chance to speak with Uncle Steve Cora, a local traditional elder, who shared his life experiences with the boys and further reiterated the themes of respect and leadership. While the boys literally could have sat there all day with Uncle Steve it was time to complete the full circle of camp and give back to the land upon which we had shared a pretty special couple of days.

For this Bryce and Talle Environmental expert Rowan Henderson arranged an activity for the boys to cut down and poison introduced plant and tree species and replacing them with native flora which will promote the native fauna to return to the

Great couple of days and something we will continue to build on with this group and the Rec School itself.



Year 7 Camp

Earlier this term we finally got to take our Year 7s for their Induction Camp.

The camp gave us the opportunity to focus on the Clontarf values, expectations and what it means to be an academy member. When we arrived the boys got straight into making fire with fire sticks, followed by a Acknowledgment of Country. The boys then tried out rock climbing with a few boys making it to the top pretty quickly.

After a bit of free time in the afternoon, we got to sit around the camp fire with the great man Andy Lovell who went through the Clontarf Values and expectations. Andy and myself were very impressed with the boys given it was their first camp with Clontarf. Overall the camp was a huge success.
