Three children have been killed by the Three children have been killed by the llu in Perth in the past few days, prompting experts to issue an urgent warning that parentsshould take their children to the doctor as soon as they show signs of the illness. The three children were all under five and lived in the metropolitan area. It is understood each of them died within 24 hours of showing the

warried that they may be mundated by worried parents, prompting the Health Department to advise them of the details of the deaths. Australian Medical Association president Geoff Dobb said influenza A strain was one of the most common during winter and that West Austra-lians were particularly vulnerable because it had been several years since the best flue arithemia.

because it had been several years since the last flu epidemic. I le said parents should not be wor-ried if their children simply had a run-ny nose and headache, though they should look out for a fever above 38C. "The critical thing is the combina-tion of a fever and a cough," he said. "What we're talking about here is not just having a runny nose and feeling unwell, often people refer to that loozely as having the flu. A true influ-enza will make you feel really unwell. enza will make you feel really unwell, more severe with cough fever and muscular aches and pain."
